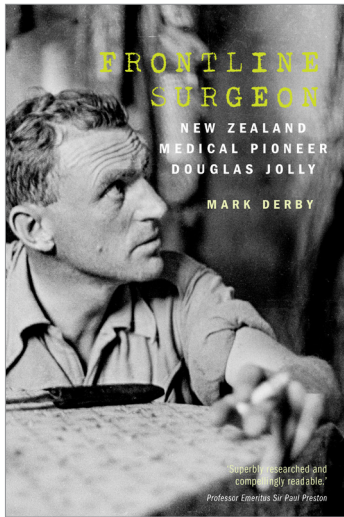

Central Otago-born Doug Jolly was one of the greatest war surgeons of the twentieth century.
